What is TuneOurBlock about?

TuneOurBlock is a research project that examines, internationalizes, and expands the Superblock concept as policy and planning strategy for transformational urban adaptation.

Municipal planners, practitioners, researchers, and NGOs co-create effective and transferable guidelines, policy options, and tools for implementing Superblocks in varied urban contexts. TuneOurBlock examines strategies to respectfully involve diverse stakeholders and explores practical steps for implementation processes. These strategies are tested in Urban Living Labs in Vienna and Berlin, validated by partners in Slovenia and with Europe-wide peer-groups of municipal and civic stakeholders.

The International Superblock Meetings

Resulting from the international exchange with the Europe-wide peer groups, a series of symposia and workshops have been conducted within TuneOurBlock. In March 2023, the first International Superblock Meeting was hosted by the City of Barcelona in cooperation with TuneOurBlock. Representatives from more than 15 European cities discussed how Superblocks and other public space transformation strategies can be applied successfully. In October 2023, the international peer groups of TuneOurBlock reconvened for a working meeting in Berlin.

In April 2024, the International Superblock Meeting in Vienna will once more bring together this growing network of stakeholders to share experiences and lessons learned with a wider audience of urban actors.
